Diabetes Corner:

How do I protect myself against low blood glucose while I am trying for tight diabetes management?

Keep glucagon handy for emergency treatment of severe low blood glucose. If it is not an emergency, a food source of glucose is the way to go. Glucagon raises blood glucose. In many ways, it does the opposite of what insulin does. You get glucagon from the pharmacy with a prescription from your doctor. Someone in your household must know how to mix up the glucagon and inject it if you become severely hypoglycemic, confused, and unable to swallow food. This will need to be done quickly. Glucagon will raise your blood glucose within 10-15 minutes, but its effect doesn't last long. Eat some crackers after you become fully conscious again. Some people are nauseated after receiving glucagon. Most severe episodes of low blood glucose happen during your sleep, so to prevent your family from having to search for the glucagon, keep it in one place, such as the refrigerator door.

The meal of Salad, Salmon, rice, green beans, and Pumpkin Pie was served.

Birthday greetings were extended to Lions Dick Holland, Tracey Marshall-Underwood, and Jennifer Marango.

Lion Rennie conducted a history quiz concerning the events that occurred on November 17th for each table to work on. The table with Lions Norm Quible, Bill and Shirley Daisey, and Aundria Hicks won the prize for the most correct answers.

Lion Rennie reviewed the "Ships" event we had several months before and asked how many members had brought theirs. She reminded the members to bring their ships to each meeting and to remember to talk to someone new each day about Lions. So bring your ships and bring in new members too.

Dover Lions Club Member Frank Jones was the guest speaker for the evening. He gave a very informative presentation on American Coin Collecting. Lion Frank told us that he got involved in coin collecting because his father worked in a bank and would bring home coins for him to search through. Lion Frank passed several of his coins around for the members and guest to view. He asked the members and guest to list all the coins that had been in circulation in this country. We were amazed to find out that there had been over 20 coins of different denomination in circulation in this country since the first coins were minted after the Revolution.

Lion Rick Watson won the prize of a collectors set of coins for having the closest answer. Lion Frank also told us that there have been 8 US Mints in operation at one time or another in the US. The state quarter series is finishing up this year and the next series will be State National Parks. Lion Frank told us that the next new coin will be a Mark Twain/Huckleberry Finn Dollar in 2010. Lion Frank gave coin collector starter sets to Cody Scheers, Lion Bruce Marvel's grandson and Lion Aundria Hicks daughter Katlyn.

Lions Gary Stumpf and Don Kirk gave reports on our Chicken Fry that was held November 8th and 9th at Rodney Village Shopping Center. Our dinner sales were down. Lion Don gave a preliminary report on tickets and money received at the door. The total was around 1,291 dinners, which is way down from our normal 2,000 meals. Discussion was held as to why the drop. One member suggested it was from lack of advertising since the signs were not placed at the ends of the parking lot as usual. The feeling was that it was a combination of lack of advertising, the economy, the fact that Governors Ave was closed at the bridge, and the lack of pre-sales of tickets.

A certificate of appreciation and a letter of thanks were presented to Cody Scheers, our guest for the evening, for his help and assistance at the Chicken Fry. Cody pitched in where needed by hauling in boxes of chicken and french fries, and cooking and serving the fries. We would have had to work harder and longer if Cody was not there to help out. Thank you Cody and we hope to see you again next year.

King Lion Rosemarie read a letter from LCI awarding our Club with the Year Round Membership Growth Patch for last year. KL Rosemarie will have it sown on our banner for all visitors to see.

Treasurer Norm reminded us to sell our Hunt Family Fiddlers tickets. We have less than a month before the show.

There being nothing further to present, King Lion Rosemarie adjourned the meeting at 8:26 PM.

The next Board of Directors meeting will be on December 1st at the Quible home.

The meeting started off with Lion Lyle Dabson stating how disappointed in the ticket sales for the Hunt Family show. At this point in time, we have not covered our expenses. We discussed additional opportunities to advertise the show and sell more tickets in the time remaining. Lyle was to pick up unsold tickets from the Lioness Club and would take them as well as other tickets to the Schwartz Center so that they can sell them. All members were encouraged to sell as many as possible. Lion Frank Jones volunteered to call all the members that Treasurer Norm has not had any response regarding ticket sales to ask that they either sell them or return them back to Treasurer Norm.

KL Rosemarie discussed the Party for the Blind and Visually Impaired to be held on Thursday December 4th at the Camden Wyoming Fire Hall. She said she had all the drivers she needed but would like as many Lions as possible to attend and see how worthwhile the party is.

The Governor's Ball was also mentioned. It will be held on Saturday December 6th at the Dover Sheraton Inn. Secretary Ralph had nothing new to report and stated that his report would be distributed in the next newsletter.

Treasurer Norm distributed the monthly report that showed the following:

KL Rose reported that the only correspondence she had received since the last meeting was a request for funds for First Night in Dover. After discussion and inquiry of Treasurer Norm as to the availability of funds, Lion Rennie made a motion to donate \$100 for First Night. Secretary Ralph seconded the motion. There was no additional discussion and the motion was passed unanimously.

Lion Rennie Quible read off the eye screening schedule and announced that she will be holding a training/review session at her home on December 12th at 7:00 PM. She has a full schedule

and needs additional help. After some discussion it was decided to ask Capitol City if they would be interested in helping with the screening.

We had some trouble with one of the new Sure Sight Devices and we had to send it back to the manufacturer to be replaced. Lions, if you can please try to do 10 to 20 percent more screenings this Lion year than you performed in the past. We should try to utilize this New Device eight months of the year.

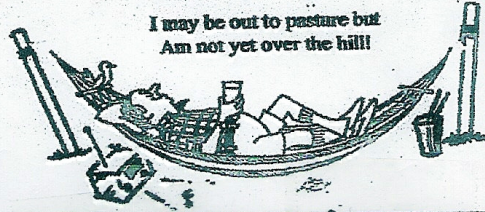

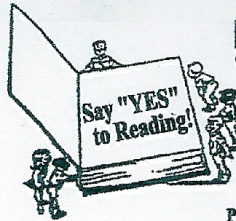
